

K-5 School District Bike Rodeo @ Meadowlark School Thursday, May 25 from 4-6 pm

Students bring a parent, your bike and helmet! You can come by the school any time between 4 and 6. This is an event to practice basic bicycling techniques, check bicycles for fit and function and provide instruction on proper helmet fit and use. The Bike Rodeo includes stations that instruct students on how to stop and start, how to avoid obstacles, how to enter and look for oncoming traffic, and how to use correct turn signals. Other stations include a bike safety video, recognizing safety signs and understanding the environmental and health benefits of riding a bike. Students should bring a parent, bike and helmet.
